

REFLECTION

"And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." ~Matthew 28:20

"Our certitudes are based on faith in Christ. In him, God has demonstrated his power, 'raising [Christ] from the dead and seating him at his right hand in the heavens.' This is the same power that God deploys in us, enabling us to achieve a similar glory. Our hope is not based on speculation, but on what God has really done for Christ. The resurrection raised him 'far above every principality, authority, power, and dominion, and every name that is named not only in this age but also in the one to come. And he put all things beneath his feet.' Nothing can any longer prevent our hope, even if an ill-wind makes it waver sometimes. It is like the flame of the Easter candle. 'The flame is weak and vacillating and always rises upward. A breath of air disturbs the flame, but it rights itself. An upward impulse restores its magic...The flame is a permanent verticality. Every poet who dreams of flame knows that the flame is living.' (G. Bachelard, *La flamme d'une chandelle*, Paris, 1961.) But Christians are not dreaming. When they look at the burning Easter candle, they see it as the symbol of the living Christ who, risen to heaven, draws them irresistibly toward the heights where the inheritance of the resurrected awaits them."
