Consecration of the Faithful to the Blessed Virgin Mary ~ Monday, April 8



At this time last year, Pope Francis invited Catholics to renew an act of consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on the Solemnity of the Annunciation of our Lord that is typically celebrated on March 25th. Our Archbishop Francis Leo sees consecration to the Blessed Virgin May as a grace-filled opportunity for the people of Toronto to be renewed in the Holy Spirit. Due to the timing of Easter this year, the Annunciation will be celebrated on Monday, April 8th. After the 9:00 am Mass on April 8th we will have the consecration to our Blessed Mother. It consists of a passage from Scripture with a short reflection, the Apostles' Creed, a decade of the Rosary, the Prayer of Consecration, and some concluding prayers. All are welcome and encouraged to attend.

By way of preparation for this consecration, there will be a prayer service at 3:00 pm on Sunday, April 8th. This is also Divine Mercy Sunday. This service will underscore Our Lady, under the title of her Immaculate Heart, as an agent of God's mercy in our lives.

COURTYARD AND WALKWAY PROJECT

As you can see, our project is underway! The walkways near the back of the Parish Centre and Ministry Centre have been removed and the area has been excavated. We are proceeding with repairs to the foundation walls and then they will be waterproofed. This area is not accessible.

- 1. The North side Sacristy & back corridor of the Church is closed. Please use the back south side door, the Blessed Sacrament Chapel door and the North side front door.
- 2. The Ministry Centre front doors are closed. Please use the back door closest to the church. A doorbell has been installed.
- 3. The Parish Centre back doors are closed. Please use the front doors.

We want to ensure everyone's safety. Please be extra cautious while walking around the property and the parking lot. The Knights of Columbus will be available to assist with directions and assistance in the parking lot. We thank you for your cooperation and patience during the construction.

REFLECTION

"Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." ~ John 20:27

<u>ARE YOU REGISTERED? IF NOT, ASK AN USHER</u>

Thomas loved Jesus doggedly, that is for sure. But he feared the dangerous situations that Jesus always walked right into. Thomas' practical nature looked frankly at them and drew the pragmatic, pessimistic conclusion. Thomas the twin had twin emotions, love and fear.

Is it any wonder, then, that in this Sunday's Gospel Thomas laid down unflinching requirements for believing in the resurrection? Take a look. His worst fears already had come true: Jesus had been killed. To deal with this sorrow Thomas resolved to accept the death stolidly. He would never slip and talk about his departed friend in the present tense, as if he were still here. Thomas the pragmatist knew that Jesus was dead and gone. He had predicted it.

Then came the new news. "Didymus, Jesus is alive! You were away, but suddenly he stood there among us even though all the doors were locked! He talked to us!" No. NO! Thomas' heart could not accept it. He wanted it too much. He could not bear to believe it. "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." (John 20:25)

This is exactly in character for Thomas/Didymus. These tough words are really a protection for a heart that would break in pieces if it were fooled by another false hope. "The only way I would believe such nonsense is if you give me absolute proof." Jesus gave it. Fingers in nail marks, hand in side.

Thomas had always belonged to Jesus. Yes, he was cynical, but when he got the practical proof he needed, he sank to the ground in heart-rending surrender. "My Lord and my God."
