ST. CLARE OF ASSISI ~ AUGUST 11



St. Francis of Assisi touched many people in his lifetime, and one of the most memorable incidents is *The Reception of St. Clare*.

Francis was the son of Assisi's leading cloth merchant, and when he decided to follow Christ, he caused quite a stir in the city. The moment of decision for him was when he stripped himself in the city square, gave his clothes to his dad, and went off to live the Gospel. Right there, he made a lasting impression on the people of the city...everyone had an opinion of him.

He continued to live near the city, and would be asked to preach in the Cathedral of St. Rufino on Sundays every once in a while.

In 1210, he told his listeners about Christ, his love for us, and how we have to try to return that love each in his or her own way. Among the listeners that day was a young blond girl who was touched by his message.

Clare Favarone was from the nobility; her uncle had just arranged an excellent match for her and no one wanted to hear about her new-found fervor for poverty and peace. She slipped away from her home, sneaked down to Our Lady of the Angels where St. Francis lived, and told him of her dream.

She accepted an olive branch from his hand as a symbol of martyrdom and then before the little community of brothers, committed herself to the pursuit of Gospel perfection.

Like Francis, she was not a woman satisfied with half measures. That very night, at her bidding, Francis shore off her beautiful hair, clothed her in a simple habit of a

cloistered nun and took her to a monastery.

For the rest of her days, St. Clare lived a life aflame with love for her Spouse. She wanted nothing more than to live in the greatest austerity of life and love Christ. San Damiano, where Francis first heard the voice of his Master, was to be her home and when the pope sought to forgive her austere vows of life she said: "Holy Father, forgive me my sins, but please let me keep my way of life."

Very quickly after she took up residence at San Damiano, many came to share her life. Her sister and her aunt were among her first companions, and over the years many continued to follow her. From the very beginning, they were known as the 'Poor Ladies of Assisi' and are popularly known as Poor Clares.

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REFLECTION

'But Jesus came and touched them, saying "Get up and do not be afraid."' ~ Matthew 17:7

'Jesus himself intervenes to bring the apostles back to the reality of the present. He "came to them, saying, 'Rise, and do not be afraid.'" Each of the verbs quoted here has its own resonances and harmonics that are very rich in meaning. They recall the way Jesus acted with the sick whom he "touched" and told him to "rise"—to resurrect?—as well as the vocabulary of the Easter visions: "Do not be afraid!" But this vocabulary is also that of the days of the Church's march toward the return of the Lord who "is coming"; these are words that ask us believers, now that we have gotten up—"resurrected"—to forge ahead without fear, and to keep watch confidently, as we accomplish the task that is for now ours. This is how we can work for the coming of the kingdom, and prepare ourselves to enter in."'
