THE ADVENT WREATH

Candles and Colours - There are four candles on the wreath, one for each week of Advent. Advent is a time of preparation and waiting. Lit candles are always a sign of the light of Christ. The liturgical colour for the season is a deep, bluish violet which represents the colour of the night sky just before dawn breaks. Three of the candles are violet, but one is pink. The pink candle reminds us that Christians know that even in the midst of darkness, the light has already come into the world. Therefore, there is cause for Joy even while we wait. The Sunday that we light this candle third is called *Gaudete* Sunday. The word *Gaudete* means rejoice.

Blessing of the Advent Wreath

Sprinkle the advent wreath with holy water, pray this prayer:



Loving God, we ask you to bless this advent wreath.

Just as the circle never ends, your love lasts through all time and all seasons.

As we light the candles, may we always remember that your Light has come into our world.

Help us to prepare our hearts for the birthday of your Son, Jesus.

We ask this through Christ, our Lord. Amen.

REFLECTION

"...stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near." (Luke 21:28)

The First Reading and the Gospel both talk about a time when the Lord comes—for justice, as the First Reading says; and for judgment, as the Gospel implies. In the Gospel, Jesus warns people not to be overcome with the pleasures and anxieties of the world but to be ready for his coming. Those who are not ready will practically die of fright when they see him. Well, then, what do we need to do to get ready? The Second Reading in effect answers that question. At Christ's coming again, we are to be blameless in holiness. And what is *that*? If you are blameless *under law*, then no one can blame you for any violation of the law of the land. You weren't speeding, for example, or cheating on your income tax, or violating any other law of the city or country in which you are. If you are *morally* blameless, then no one can blame you for any violation of the moral law. You weren't lying, for example, or cheating on your spouse, or violating any other command of the universal moral law that applies to all people no matter where they are. But what is it to be blameless *in holiness*? The answer is in the Second Reading: in order to be ready for Christ at his coming, Christians need to increase in love and abound in it.

So here's the thing to see. You can keep all the laws of your land and still be a real jerk. And the same truth holds for the moral law. You can be a priggishly righteous jerk, too. Something more than having a great record for keeping the laws is necessary to be ready for the Lord. That more is love. If you want what is bad for your neighbor, if you curse him in public or even in your heart, if you wish he would just go away, if you tell him in your thoughts or to his face to go to hell—you do not love him. And you are blameworthy with regard to holiness if you don't. It doesn't matter how moral or legal your conduct is otherwise. To be blameless in holiness, then, takes being loving. And being loving is what makes us ready for the return of the Lord.

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
