CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: A NEW TIME AND PLACE FOR CONFESSIONS

Confessions are heard on a weekly basis on Saturdays from 9 to 10 am in the Mary Chapel. In addition, during our monthly Eucharistic Adoration (first Monday of each month) confessions are heard from 1 to 2 pm. Finally, you can always make an appointment with Fr. Peter or Fr. Tom to celebrate this Sacrament in which we encounter our merciful God.

DAY OF CONFESSIONS ~ WEDNESDAY, MARCH 22

The friars will be available to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation with individuals on Wednesday, March 22, from 9:30 to 10:30 a.m., 12 to 1 p.m., and 7 to 8 p.m. in the Mary Chapel.

LITURGY OF THE WORD WITH CHILDREN

Liturgy of the Word with Children resumes this Sunday, March 19 at 10 a.m. For children ages 4 to 9 (older children who "missed out" the past two years due to pandemic restrictions may participate.) A parent is welcome to accompany a child who is too shy to participate on their own.

SOLEMNITY OF ST. JOSEPH, SPOUSE OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

This year, the Solemnity of St. Joseph is transferred to Monday, March 20. The traditional date of the feast (March 19) falls on the Fourth Sunday of Lent. Sunday, as the original and primary feastday of the Church, takes precedence over the feastday of the saint, who is the Patron of the Universal Church as well as the Principal Patron of Canada.

Blessing of a St. Joseph's Table:

"All-Provident God, the good things that grace this table remind us of your many good gifts. Bless this food, and by the prayers of Saint Joseph, who provided bread for your Son and food for the poor, sustain us and all our brothers and sisters on our journey toward your heavenly kingdom.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Couples must contact the Ministry Centre at least one year in advance of the anticipated date. A preparation course is also required.

REFLECTION

"Jesus said to him, 'You have seen him, and the one speaking with you is he.' [The man whose sight was restored] said, 'Lord, I believe.' And he worshipped him." ~ John 9:37-38

"We are called to choose the light. It is an article of our faith that God sees us as we are and sees us lovingly. We believe that truthful sight is therefore inseparable from a loving look. Equally I only really see lovingly in so far as I see truthfully, and cleanse my eyes of the distortions of infatuation or disgust. Pope Benedict wrote:

Truth needs to be sought, found and expressed within the 'economy' of charity, but charity in its turn needs to be understood, confirmed and practiced in the light of truth. In this way, not only do we do a service to charity enlightened by truth, but we also help give credibility to truth, demonstrating its persuasive and authenticating power in the practical setting of social living. (Caritas in Veritate, par. 2)

So baptism implies that we choose to look lovingly so as to see truthfully, and to look truthfully so as to learn love....How do we learn to see a human face? Perhaps we begin to wipe our eyes clean by acknowledging that if someone seems repulsive or contemptible to me, or even unattractive, it is because I do not yet see them properly.
