THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

Confessions are heard on a weekly basis on Saturdays from 9 to 10 am in the Mary Chapel. In addition, you can always make an appointment with Fr. Peter or Fr. Tom to celebrate this Sacrament of God's mercy.

PREPARING FOR THE SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Couples who want to marry at St. Bonaventure's Parish or are planning a marriage outside of the Archdiocese of Toronto (for example, in another diocese either in Canada or in another country) are required to meet with either Friar Tom or Friar Peter and complete their preparations in the Archdiocese of Toronto. One of either the bride or the groom (i.e., the Catholic party) ought to live within the parish boundaries, or, if living outside the parish boundaries, should be a registered parishioner and participate in Eucharist on a regular basis. It is a policy of the Archdiocese of Toronto that one year's advance notice is required for marriages. It is important that couples do not book reception venues, etc., before contacting either Friar Tom or Friar Peter.

We resume our first Monday of the month prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. Please join us along with one grade of students from St. Bonaventure School for Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

- 12:50 Children head back to school
 - Adoration continues with others who are present. This is open to all. A particular invitation is extended to the children's parents, grandparents, and godparents.
- 1:00 Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available in the Mary Chapel from 1:00 pm to 2:00 pm.
- 2:00 Benediction with the Blessed Sacrament (hymn and incensation) followed by reposition.

REFLECTION

"You are not far from the kingdom of God." (Mark 12:34)

In the Gospel Reading, a scribe asks Jesus, "Which is the first of all the commandments?" Maybe the point of asking this question is like the point of asking, "what are the most important requirements for this course?" A student who wants that information is trying to figure out what is crucial for passing the course. In his view, if he does the most important thing, maybe he doesn't have to do everything else.

In response to the scribe's question, Jesus tells him not only the commandment that is the first of all but also the one that is second. Taken together the two commandments cover the ground. "you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength..... [and] you shall love your neighbor as yourself."

So if the scribe does just the most important things, he will have done pretty close to everything, won't he? If he was hoping for a way to get through without doing everything required for the kingdom of heaven, these two commandments will show him that he hasn't got a chance. If he doesn't do everything, he will have done virtually nothing, because he will have failed at the most important stuff.

There is something that the scribe likes about the answer of Jesus: it privileges morality above ritual. And so the scribe thinks that he has found *something* that isn't crucial for getting into heaven. *Yes*, the scribe says to Jesus affirmingly, *obeying these two commandments is better than sacrifice*. Jesus doesn't disagree. But what he says to the scribe is, "you are not far from the kingdom of God." Not far?! How can the scribe be distant in *any* way if he understands these commandments and accepts them as most important for the kingdom of heaven?

But here is the thing to see. What person among us loves God with all his heart? Who loves his neighbor as himself? If obeying these commandments is the most important thing for getting into heaven, what hope is there for anybody? The answer is—Jesus. He is the Savior, who came to rescue people from their failures to obey the most important commandments. All true hope of the kingdom of heaven lies in him. And so the scribe, who is next to Jesus, is not far from the kingdom of heaven in more than one sense.
