MESSAGES OF PEACE

Pope Declares Friday a Day of Fasting, Penance and Prayer for Peace in the World Posted: Archdiocese of Toronto, October 19, 2023

During his general audience on Wednesday, His Holiness, Pope Francis declared that Friday, October 27, is to be a day of fasting, penance and prayer for peace. The Holy Father invited, "the various Christian confessions, members of other religious, and all who hold the cause of peace in the world at heart to participate." A Vigil will take place at 6 p.m. in St. Peter's Square, where an hour of prayer in a spirit of penance to implore peace in our time, in this world. "Our thoughts turn to Palestine and Israel. The number of victims is rising and the situation in Gaza is desperate," the Pope continued. "Please, let everything possible be done to avoid a humanitarian disaster." The United Nations said Tuesday that more than 4,200 people have been killed and over 1 million people have been displaced in a short span of only 10 days.

Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops President Issues a Plea for Peace in the Holy Land Posted: Archdiocese of Toronto, October 12, 2023

The Most Rev. William McGrattan, president of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB), has issued a statement urging the Catholic faithful in Canada to unite in prayer for peace in the Middle East.

"Over these last few days, the world has witnessed a rapid escalation of armed conflict in the Holy Land, with reports of a growing number of wounded or dead, including innocent civilians," said Bishop McGrattan, "As the Holy Land is immersed in this violence and bloodshed, we remember that Jesus, the Son of God, who lived and walked there as Love Incarnate, through His teaching by word and deed, calls us as brothers and sisters to be always united by the bond of charity. "As Christians we are compelled by the teachings and example of Jesus to pray for peace throughout the world."

"As we pray for peace, let us remember all the families and individuals suffering because of this most recent outbreak of violence."

REFLECTION

"Give therefore to the emperor the things that are the emperor's, and to God the things that are God's." ~Matthew 22:21

Maybe Jesus made his statement to settle the argument that was posed to him by the Pharisees. Alright, here is a key. Can God and Caesar co-exist? What if each of us is created to be a channel for God's presence right in the midst of the secular world? What if, in spite of the voices within you that say you are not worth much, in spite of the setbacks of life, the losses, the flatness, in spite of all these, what if God created you with room inside you where God, out of love for you, can be quietly present?

I can hear objections to such an idea: "God would never be at home in me, not until I do a lot better with my life." Or, "You want me to be some kind of nut, running around acting holy?" Or, "Sure, I want to let God in, but I like beer and TV too much." Or, "What does all this have to do with real life?" Or simply, "I don't want to." But what if God were a great friend? In fact, how would it be if God were a companion who truly and actually accepts you and forgives you completely whenever you need it? Wouldn't this give you another way to look at the connection between heaven and earth? Wouldn't it mean that God put you and me into the world to be holy in it, to be friends with the things of Caesar? To work in the world of sin in spite of our own sins?

Could it be that we ourselves are "those things that belong to God" that Jesus spoke of? "Belong," not in a possessive way, but in the way felt by people who love and are loved. That might be how we "belong." If this were so, why wouldn't we want to give ourselves to God, and then also to bring our God-filled selves to Caesar's palaces and to the dirty roads outside them and show everyone what Jesus is all about? Which realm should we live in? Both. John Foley, SJ
