The Installation of Rev. Thomas Reist, OFM Conv. as Pastor of The Franciscan Church of St. Bonaventure

On Sunday, October 16th during the 10 a.m. Eucharist, the Most Reverend Robert Kasun, CSB, Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Toronto, installs Friar Tom Reist as Pastor of our parish.

In the Introduction to this celebration, we read: "Installation is the term used for the ceremony in which a pastor takes possession of the parish to which he has been appointed. The appointment of a new pastor is an important stage in the life of a community of faith. The pastor is entrusted by the bishop with the spiritual care of the people of this parish and is called to be the teacher of God's Word, leader in prayer and worship, and guide in living according to the Gospel. The new pastor comes to continue the good work done through the years in this community and to share his God-given gifts with the people. Ontario Municipal and Schoolboard Elections October 24, 2022

Before you vote: check your designation as a Catholic school supporter, especially if you have recently moved, bought a home, or are renting. If you are not designated as a Catholic school supporter, you will not be eligible to vote for a Catholic School Trustee.

How do I find out if I'm registered as a Catholic School supporter?

The easiest way is to look at your voter registration card which you have received in the mail, or through the City of Toronto "My Vote" election site:

At the bottom of the card, it should say either English Catholic or French Catholic (Separate)

Changing School Support Status at the Polling Station

If your school support status is incorrect, ask for an 'Application to Amend Voters' List'. This form may be completed and submitted at the polling station. Ensure the ballot you are given is a Catholic school ballot, with your school support listed as either English Catholic or French Catholic (Separate).

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

Information about and how to register our parish's children and youth for sacramental preparation programs 2022-23 will be made available shortly. Children age 7+ may be registered to prepare to celebrate the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist. Youth age 12+ may be registered to prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation.

HUMANITARIAN RELIEF FOR PAKISTAN FLOODS

Devastating floods in Pakistan have displaced hundreds of thousands, at one point leaving a third of the country inundated with water. More than 1,500 people have died following record rainfall with 33 million throughout the country affected by this disaster.

Since June, Pakistan has experienced three times more rainfall than an average monsoon season. Flooding and landslides have destroyed homes, crops, health centres, roads and bridges.

There is an elevated risk of the spread of malaria, dengue fever and other diseases. Priorities include clean water, shelter and health care for those directly affected by this tragic situation.

The Archdiocese of Toronto will channel donations through Catholic partners (including Caritas Canada - Development and Peace as well as the Archdiocese of Karachi) to support relief efforts underway. Please note that these organizations are not subject to the government matching funds program.

Please continue to pray for those who have died and been displaced as a result of this tragic situation in Pakistan.

Dear Sisters in the League:

Your Parish Executive Council welcomes you to a new season of League events and meetings as we continue our cautious exit from the pandemic. The Parish Team has confirmed to us that restrictions, as to the use of the Parish Hall for League activities, are slowly being lifted. We look forward to in-person meetings while observing every precaution to keep everyone safe.

As League members we are part of the largest of group of Catholic women in Canada, but also Catholic women in the world through WUCWO (World Union of Catholic Women's Organizations). All these women are our sisters and are offering their prayers for us. Our views are represented through resolutions, letters, and visits to government. Collectively, we are a strong voice of thousands, rather than the lone voice of one individual.

Going forward...

We are in planning stages for upcoming events: planting a Healing Garden in memory of indigenous children who died in residential schools, Christmas gift bags for the Good Shepherd Centre, general meetings with discussions on topics such as anxiety issues, racism, supporting indigenous initiatives, cyber bullying, hope for the environment, World Day of Prayer planning, etc.

Plans are in the works to bring back our in-person **Advent Retreat** and **Advent Luncheon**. We are also happy to announce that our first general meeting for members will be October 25th, 2022, at 7:00 in the Parish Hall. Many important items have to be discussed including the increase of our yearly dues.

Per Capita Increase

The national per capita fee increase of \$12.00 was approved at the National Convention in August 2022 becoming effective with the 2023 membership dues collection. The total national per capita fee becomes \$25.00 per member. After adding in the Provincial and Toronto Diocesan per capita amounts of \$3.00 and \$4.00 respectively, regional dues of \$2.00 and insurance at \$0.50 per member the total becomes \$34.50 per member. Please be advised that a vote will be taken at the General Members Meeting on October 25th, 2022, at 7:00 pm in the Parish Hall, to raise the membership fees effective for the 2023 membership year to \$40.00. Current fees are \$25.00 per annum.


League Structure

REFLECTION

"And yet, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?' ~ Luke 18:8

"But, you ask, what are acts of faith? These are some of them. Going often to prayer is an act of faith....Trying to be attentive to your prayers is an act of faith. Behaving in the house of God otherwise than you would in an ordinary place is an act of faith...

These are acts of faith, because they are acts that you would accomplish if you saw and understood that God is present, though your eyes and ears neither see nor hear him. But 'happy are they who have not seen, and have believed!'
